

LET GOD RECREATE YOU

o you know that God loves you so much that, even when you're heading down a path that leads to destruction, He desires to pull you out? When you build a relationship with God, He reveals the harmful choices you're unaware of—choices that might seem beneficial physically or emotionally, but spiritually, they lead to ruin. Without spiritual insight, you're limited to judging things by appearance, which often results in poor decisions. That's why many people make costly mistakes—in marriage, relationships, careers, relocation, and business. They connect with the wrong people or follow a path that feels right but leads to pain. This happens because the human mind is limited. You act based on how you think, and if your thinking isn't led by the Spirit of God, you'll likely be misled.

Only when your mind is transformed by the Spirit can you consistently prosper. The Spirit of Truth clears your path and helps you make decisions that align with your destiny. Physical thinking limits your future, but spiritual thinking safeguards it. Every Spirit-led decision you make protects you from future challenges and consequences.

Let me tell you something: just because a sin or mistake isn't affecting you now doesn't mean it won't catch up to you. Many people feel comfortable in sin because the consequences seem

delayed. But every sin plants a seed that grows in the future. That's why Scripture says (paraphrased), "Jesus Christ will return like a thief in the night." Judgment comes when you least expect it. Trouble often shows up during the calmest seasons of your life, not because you anticipated it, but because it was quietly taking root through unwise choices.

The consequences of sin appear when your heart isn't aligned with God. But when you're connected to Him, He warns you ahead of time—if you're spiritually sensitive. If you don't train your spirit to hear from God, how will you recognize when He speaks?

Many people blame God when things go wrong, asking, "Lord, where were You?" But the question is—where were you when you were supposed to seek understanding, study the Word, and align with His will? God won't act in your life until you agree with Him. That's why some situations go unresolved—God can't override your free will. You must be willing to align with Him.

There's a spirit of understanding, one of the seven spirits of God, that must govern your decisions. Scripture says, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." When you pursue spiritual priorities, you're prepared for what lies ahead. Too many people live only for the moment, unprepared for the future. That's why they're blind sided by challenges.

Your decisions today determine whether you will suffer or rejoice tomorrow. A humble person understands that human reasoning is inadequate without spiritual guidance. The Spirit's understanding equips you to overcome what's coming, because future trials are already written in the spirit realm.

God knows your tomorrow. That's why He gave commandments—to guide you onto a path of peace, purpose, and fulfillment. His commands are not restrictions; they are protection. They direct every part of your life—your purpose, your assignments—and ensure you walk a straight path.

Many of you are crying out for restoration. But before God can restore your life, you must allow Him to recreate you. This is what it means to be born again. He has to start anew because many of your past decisions have become like unwanted furniture in a house—you are that house. The choices you made are now cluttering your spiritual space, misaligning your identity and blocking favor. That's why you're battling rejection and struggling to attract favor. You've allowed the wrong people, ideas, and spiritual influences into your life. These things have become resident demons—strongholds—because you unknowingly welcomed them.

You sense something is wrong, but you can't pinpoint what. That's because the real issue is hidden deep within—rooted in choices that don't reflect God's design for you. To fix it, you must be willing to partner with God, consistently choosing His way. You must make new decisions that counter the damaging ones from your past. Decisions must fight decisions; actions must undo actions. You need God to tear down the old structure. You've been building your life based on earthly knowledge, on what works for others, and what appears successful. But copying others leads to a borrowed identity. You talk about grace and mercy without understanding them. You've adopted other people's patterns and made them your personality.

When God starts recreating you, He speaks prophetically over your life. He created the world through His Word, and He will recreate you the same way. "Let there be light" means His Word illuminates your life and guides you forward. When you're aligned with God, His Word becomes your roadmap, your identity, and your manifestation.

Prayer: Father, recreate me. Remold me. Rearrange my life. Align me with Your perfect will. Amen.

You, as a person, must pray for God's likeness to be formed in your life. If you don't ask for it, God won't force it into you. This is why it's important to align with the Spirit of God—the Spirit of Revelation—so that He fills you with divine knowledge. That way, you'll know what to pray for at each stage of your life.

Many people don't even know what they truly need or how to navigate life. But when we pray, the Spirit of Understanding directs our prayers. He teaches us what to ask for and leads us to pray with purpose and clarity. When you're led by the Spirit, your prayers become timely, and you begin to walk in divine alignment. You'll pray the right prayers at the right time, and these prayers will position you to fulfill your purpose. Without God in you—without His image and likeness—you'll struggle. Your purpose will remain unfulfilled, and life will feel like a constant battle.



Many of you have asked:

- "Why do things fall apart just when I'm about to succeed?"
- "Why do I face resistance every time I'm close to breakthrough?"
- "Why does affliction seem constant in my life?"

The answer often lies in the fact that you're trying to fulfill your destiny without being rooted in God's likeness. How can someone who hasn't even eaten to satisfaction fulfill their assignment? If your needs remain unmet, how can you serve effectively? That's why God gives commandments. But many of you don't want to ask God for instruction. If you're truly sensitive to your calling, your gifts, your dreams, and your life's purpose, you'll learn to walk by His commands. And if you don't yet understand His commandments, you must ask for the Spirit of Understanding.

Every commandment has a purpose. It guides you through each phase of your life. You ask, "When is my time coming?"—but the very commandment that ushers in your time, you've ignored. Some commandments are difficult. They may require you to separate from loved ones—even family. Why? Because God sees all. He knows who will fight you, who the enemy will send, and how they'll try to derail your purpose.

That's why His commandments apply not just to strangers but to your own household. As Scripture says, "A man's enemies will be members of his own household" (paraphrased). God molds you to be impartial. Many of you treat strangers righteously but compromise with family. You don't realize that these emotional loopholes become entry points for the enemy. If you're not firm—if you don't remove emotion and stand on righteousness—then the enemy will penetrate through those closest to you.

God's commandments are for all. When He molds you, He does it through instructions. Just as an engineer follows a blueprint when building a house, God follows a divine structure when building your life. These instructions form your foundation. When storms come—and they will—they won't destroy you, because you're built on truth and order.

In the book of Exodus, God demonstrated that He is a God of organization. When instructing the Israelites to build the temple, He gave detailed plans. He told Moses that every priest must wear specific garments. This shows how precise God is when building your life. He uses commandments and instructions to lead you into your Promised Land.

But if you don't take time to reflect and seek what's best for your soul, you'll lose yourself chasing what's harmful. You are built with divine instructions. These laws are written on your heart. As Scripture says, "I will write my laws in their hearts" (paraphrased). These laws guide your conscience and decisions. Because I know how I'm built, I live differently. And you, too, must connect with God to learn how He designed you.

Otherwise, you'll live by imitation, following the world instead of your divine pattern. The book of Exodus also says, "Do not follow the multitude to do evil" (paraphrased). There's a reason behind every command—God wants to protect you from destruction.



- "Do not defile the bed."
- "Do not steal."
- "Do not commit adultery."

All these commands are not burdens—they're safeguards. But many reject God's blueprint. You say, "I don't want to be religious; I just want to be normal, social, and live like the world." In doing so, you elevate yourself above your Creator. The One who designed you gives you instructions, and you respond with rebellion.

Scripture says, "My people perish for lack of knowledge." You came into the world without knowing how you were formed, yet you act as if you know better than God. When you begin to awaken spiritually, your first question should be, "Father, how did You create me? What have You placed in me that I must guard?"

Every time you go against a divine instruction—even the smallest—you weaken your foundation. Imagine water slowly seeping into the foundation of a house. Over time, cracks form. That's what sin and disobedience do to your soul. Many of the troubles you face are a result of letting these issues dwell too long.

God doesn't desire trouble for you. The Bible says, "The thoughts I have for you are of good, not of evil—to give you a future and a hope." If only you knew His heart, you'd obey more easily. Just like a loving parent warns a child not to touch fire, God warns us. But when the child doesn't listen, one day, the parent may allow them to feel the burn. And once they do, they'll never touch it again.

Likewise, God allows certain hardships because you refuse to listen. For some of you, your stubbornness has drawn intense battles into your life. And when you call on God, He may say, "Endure it. Learn from it. Then come back and ask Me for wisdom." Why? Because there are lessons in the pain. There's a molding process in the struggle. Some of you have faced the same battles repeatedly. You've seen them in dreams. You've sensed the pattern. Yet you haven't learned the lesson. That's why the cycle continues. Until you stop, reflect, and ask God for understanding, those battles will persist.

There are many of you I see in the spirit who are about to face significant battles. If you don't build yourself up in God now, these battles will limit both your success and your timing. Time does not wait for anyone.

Imagine this: You're writing an exam in a dream. The invigilator hands you the paper, but you start looking for a pen. Time is running out. At the end, you never write the exam—not because you couldn't, but because you were distracted. In the same way, if you don't build spiritual maturity, challenges will distract you and become obstacles to your next level.

Many of you often ask, "Why am I stagnant in life?" Stagnation results from not learning how to overcome the battles assigned to your level. As human beings, we are both physical and spiritual. Therefore, we face both physical and spiritual battles. When we fail to deal with either, it causes delay. Delay is not just because of what others have done to you—witchcraft, ancestral curses, or evil altars. Even when arrows are sent your way, it is often your lack of spiritual understanding that keeps you from overcoming. And that lack of understanding keeps you in one place.

Can I tell you something? When you're stagnant spiritually, you will also be stagnant physically—no matter how talented or gifted you are. This explains why many are delayed in marriage, finances, purpose, and destiny. You're not delayed because of external enemies alone, but because you're not growing in understanding or spiritual capacity.

You need to:

- Learn
- Understand
- Apply that understanding to your challenges
 That's the only way to move forward.

Many are facing battles but still refuse to learn. Instead, they rely on their own understanding. This pride leads to delay. Ignorance delays you. Lack of wisdom delays you.

Some of you, out of a "good heart," have brought problems into your lives. Because you lack spiritual vision, you can't see that the very person you welcomed is the one delaying your destiny. A good heart without wisdom and discernment is dangerous.

This is also true in marriage. Many people don't know what they want in a partner. Some men are involved with four women. Some women are talking to five men. You're confused, indecisive, and unable to choose the right person. That confusion leads to delay. And for many, that confusion leads to marrying the wrong person. Once that happens, your purpose, assignment, and career may come to a halt. Why? Because you made a decision based on physical insight, not spiritual discernment.

We do not make choices by sight—we make them by the Spirit. Only the Spirit can expose what physical eyes cannot. As humans, you cannot know someone's heart just by looking at them. But when you walk in the Spirit, you can discern what is hidden. As Scripture says:

"As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he" (paraphrased).

People can appear kind, even righteous—but the real question is: What's in their heart? That's why God examines the heart, not just the words. We must stop making decisions based on appearances. Decisions must be made by the Spirit.

The Spirit of God teaches you all things—not just in marriage or business, but in every area of life. Why? Because if the enemy



can't stop you in one area, he'll attack another. If it's not your marriage, it may be your job. If not your job, then your finances. If not your finances, then your mental health. That's why the Bible says, "The Spirit of God will teach you all things" (paraphrased). You must be spiritually equipped in every area, or the devil will look for a weakness to exploit.

Prayer:

I block every path in my life that the enemy could use to enter, in the name of Jesus Christ.

Even when the devil cannot find a way into your life now, he will wait for you to make a mistake. So while he's waiting, what are you doing? You must be in the presence of God, consistently growing in consciousness and spiritual maturity. You don't wait until a problem shows up to pray. You must stay ahead of the enemy by dwelling in God's presence. That's how you gain spiritual speed. Many are praying for speed in life—but if you want to move in divine speed, stay in God's presence. This keeps you ahead of your enemies.

As you grow in God:

- You disconnect from negativity.
- Your life is no longer hindered.
- You enjoy sustained peace and progress.

There will come a time when everything seems to go well in your life. You'll ask yourself, "Why is everything moving so smoothly?" It's because you've stayed ahead of the enemy.

God molds you through continual spiritual growth, giving you power and wisdom that helps you avoid bad decisions. And when you're not making poor choices, the devil loses access to your life and destiny. When there's no access point, the enemy can't touch your life.

Spiritual battles usually show up during transitions—when you're about to level up. But if you're already spiritually prepared, you'll overcome them quickly. Don't spend years stuck in the same battle. Don't delay your destiny fighting the same demons over and over. Look at the Israelites. After leaving Egypt, they wandered for forty years in the wilderness. Why? Because they kept repeating the same mistakes. Don't let that be you. Every challenge should be temporary—based on the capacity you've developed. The greater your spiritual strength, the faster you'll overcome.

In the book of Daniel, there was a prophet whose prayers were being blocked by the prince of Persia. Though angels were sent, they couldn't get through until God sent Michael to fight on his behalf. This teaches us that some battles require higher power. You need spiritual energy and capacity for certain challenges. Prepare in advance. Build yourself now. Don't allow a single challenge to delay your life for decades. The strength you carry determines the demons you can defeat.

Some of you have been battling the same family altar your whole lives. You fight, but it never ends. You say, "This sickness or pattern comes and goes." But it hasn't truly left because you haven't grown above it.

That is why many of you are not fully enjoying the love of God—because challenges have caused you to doubt His existence. When you remain too long in a problem, you begin to doubt yourself, then doubt God, and eventually doubt everything around you. This is why staying too long in a problem is dangerous. Yes, problems will come—Jesus said so. But you were never meant to remain in them indefinitely. Jacob once said, "I will not let You go


unless You bless me" (paraphrased). Can you carry that same mindset Can you be determined to pray until there's evidence of victory? Will you hold on to God until the battle is won?

You must:

- Ask God to teach you.
- Ask God to mold you.
- Ask God to prepare you.

The only place this happens is in His presence. Stay in the presence of God to be prepared for what's ahead. There is no other way to endure and overcome. As you grow in life, financially, you will begin to overcome the demons that hinder financial breakthrough. As you grow maritally, you'll overcome the spiritual forces that hinder marriages. As you grow spiritually, you'll overcome the demon of destruction. Knowledge is power, but wisdom is better. Scripture says, "Wisdom is profitable to direct" (Ecclesiastes 10:10), and "In all your getting, get understanding" (Proverbs 4:7). If you know certain truths, there are things you simply won't do. But many of you ignore the warnings God gives. You dismiss the small instructions, saying, "Is this really what will cause my problem? I don't believe it." But let me tell you: it is spiritual. Many of you don't realize that your actions and disobedience can open doors to dangerous demonic oppression. You don't believe that something so "small" could be the cause—but it is.

A prophet may tell you, "Walk this way. Do this." But your response is, "Prophet, you don't understand. This battle is deeply spiritual. I just need deliverance. I need you to pray for me!" But the prophet is giving you solutions—clear, Spirit-led instructions. Yet you reject them because you want deliverance, not counsel. But how long will you keep seeking deliverance?



How long will hands be laid on your head, oil poured, salt added, water sprinkled, and yet nothing changes? Why? Because the root of your breakthrough lies in instruction, not just in prayer.

God may send you a solution you don't expect. Remember: "God uses the foolish things to confound the wise" (1 Corinthians 1:27). What may seem like simple advice—something too small or irrelevant—is often your actual answer. Many of you don't need another prayer—you need divine counsel. You need to obey the instructions and watch as they begin to work in your life. But no—you are so convinced your situation is only spiritual warfare that you ignore the practical obedience required. You assume someone is always doing evil to you, when the real issue is your own refusal to follow divine instruction. You just want things to be easy. But why is it so hard for you to simply do what is right? What is wrong with obeying God's voice? Don't you know that even demons follow instructions? They cannot enter a life unless certain conditions are met. There's always a pattern, a structure, and a legal access point. In the spirit realm, this is called protocol. And yet you—the one being attacked—don't want to follow any spiritual structure or instruction to be free. They've prayed over your life. They've laid hands on you. They've poured oil and water. They've baptized you. They've anointed you with salt. And yet the problem continues to "come and go." Why Because prayer alone is not your solution.

Prayer is powerful, yes—but every issue has a specific method of resolution. Some require action. Some require counsel. Some require humility. Some require total obedience. If you want to grow in life, learn to follow instructions. And how do you follow divine instructions? By building your relationship with God, so you can clearly hear Him say:

- "Don't go there."
- "Do this instead."
- "Speak to this person."
- "Stay away from that place."

There are many of you facing battles that feel impossible to win. You've even given up on yourself. The battle has beaten you down so badly that you've buried your own confidence. You've said to yourself, "I cannot overcome this." So, even when you're given instructions, you don't obey because you doubt yourself.

Let me tell you: as long as you doubt yourself, you will never follow what is right. You'll keep searching for more prayers, but inwardly, you've already accepted defeat. The moment you say, "I can overcome this," you'll become willing to follow God's leading, and that decision will begin to change everything.

So, ask God to recreate you. Ask Him to restore your ability to obey and follow instructions. Don't look down on yourself. Don't think, "I'm not strong enough to obey." Instead, cry out, "Father, what must I do?" When you're truly walking with God, He won't just listen to your prayers—He'll respond with instructions. As a

prophet of God, I can tell you confidently: When I pray, God doesn't only answer with power; He responds with strategy. While you're crying out, "Lord, help me!"—He's saying, "Do this. Go here. Speak to this person. Leave that place. Change this behavior." In the instruction lies your miracle.

Life is spiritual. Everything you do carries a prophetic weight, and every step you take should be aligned with divine instruction—because that's where your manifestation comes from. While you're praying, be ready to listen. Many of you are praying, yet rejecting the word God sends through others. You say, "That's not my problem—I just need deliverance!" But let me ask: If deliverance is all you needed, why haven't you been delivered yet? That's the problem. You want prayer without obedience, and miracles without process.

Let me tell you the truth: if God took six days to create the universe and rested on the seventh, don't expect Him to recreate your life in one day—especially when you've been walking the wrong path for years. Yes, God can act in the eleventh hour—but even the eleventh hour is reached through a process. God works in stages. He said, "Let there be light," before anything else. Why? Because the earth was formless, void, and full of darkness—just like many lives today. Before God can create or restore anything in you, light must come first. That light is truth—the knowledge of God. Without light (truth), God cannot fill your life with purpose, order, and power. He cannot bless what remains in darkness. He brought light, and then He began to separate, build, restructure, and fill. The same applies to you—He wants to remove confusion and disorder, but He starts with truth.

You must stop expecting transformation just because you fasted for 10 days or said a salvation prayer. Some of you cry, "Woman of God, I prayed, I fasted, but nothing changed! My business is still down, my marriage is still crashing!" Why hasn't anything changed? Because you haven't changed. You've come to God not with repentance or hunger for truth, but with hidden agendas. Some of you only connect with others because of what you can gain from them—not because of love, not because of integrity, but because of selfish ambition. You have the spirit of deception, the heart of a user, always seeking what benefits you. That's why nothing is working. It's not always spiritual warfare—it's a matter of the heart. God cannot bless a heart full of greed, manipulation, and lies. And many of you wonder why you're in bad relationships, why nothing is lasting, why your life seems to attract pain. It's not always witchcraft—sometimes it's your own decisions rooted in poor values and impure motives.

Let's be honest: Some women go after men only for their money. Some men pursue women only for sex. Then when things fall apart, you blame demons or altars. But the truth is—it was never built on character.

The world is full of wolves, and you must stop being naïve. As a woman, don't expect men to treat you well just because you're beautiful. The truth is, your beauty can attract users who only want to drain you. That's why many beautiful women end up heartbroken—not because they're cursed, but because they weren't spiritually prepared. People are drawn to good things—but not everyone who is drawn to you has the ability or character to sustain and protect what they admire. So, stop saying: "Woman of God, I don't know why men keep leaving me." "I don't know why I always meet the wrong people." You must ask yourself: Are you

discerning? Are you prepared for the wolves? Do you set your standards according to God's Word—or are you living in a fantasy?


Some of you are in 12-year relationships with no commitment, no clarity, and no purpose. You're in your 30s or 40s, still "dating," and blaming spiritual warfare. But no demon forced you to stay there. Your choices did. Demons don't enter your life unless your own decisions open the door. Your mind is the gate. Your desires are signals. The devil smells ungodly desires—and that's how he finds legal entry. That's why the Bible says, "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind." A renewed mind is a protected life. Jesus told His disciples, "I send you out as sheep among wolves—be wise as serpents and harmless as doves." That's your reality. You're not surrounded by sheep—you're surrounded by wolves. So be wise, be discerning, and stop complaining. Wrong people will come—expect it. But when your values are right, you won't stay stuck in those wrong connections.

Ladies, start setting standards according to God's will. Don't fall for a man just because he buys you food, gifts, or gives you attention. Set your eyes on his character, not his wallet. A man who treats God well will treat you well. Why? Because he's not just trying to please you—he's committed to pleasing his Master. And in doing that, he builds the kind of character that creates a healthy, godly relationship. Not all men who pamper you with money love you. Some use money to manipulate, and when the money is gone—they're gone. Likewise, some women only stay while the money flows. Once it dries up, they leave, saying, "You can't afford me."

This is the deception of the generation we're in.

Final Words of Truth:

- Life is spiritual.
- Be wise. Be discerning. Be intentional.
- Don't confuse deception with divine delay.
- Stop blaming altars when it's your attitude.
- Renew your mind.
- Desire truth, not just breakthrough.
- Set standards.
- Let God recreate you.
